WALK-IN LEGAL CLINIC

CILC has a free walk-in legal clinic where you can talk to a volunteer immigration lawyer or accredited representative about your case.

The following services are available at the clinics:

- Brief, confidential consultations on immigration issues
- Case assessment by immigration lawyers or accredited representatives
- Questions answered about immigration forms

INFORMATION & REFERRAL

During the walk-in clinic, an experienced immigration lawyer or accredited representative will discuss with you your immigration concerns. Participants who need further assistance will be referred to a list of local immigration lawyers or accredited representatives. CILC does not represent people in their immigration cases.

WHEN & WHERE

Walk-in clinics are held on the 2nd and 4th Friday of the month from 2:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. at Christ Presbyterian Church at 944 East Gorham Street in Madison. Walk-in clinics are only on the 2nd Friday in November and December due to the holidays. No appointment needed. First come, first served.

CILC is easily accessible by car, bus and bike. Directions are on the back.

If you are coming to the clinic for assistance, please bring with you:

- Copies of all documents relating to your immigration case
- Copies of all documents relating to any criminal cases you may have had
- Any other documents relating to your case that you think might be important or about which you have questions

LANGUAGE

Spanish-language interpreters will be available. If you require interpretation in another language, please contact us ahead of time and we will arrange for a qualified interpreter to be there.

OUTREACH AND ADVOCACY

CILC offers training and education on immigration law and immigrants' rights to the community and welcomes the opportunity to collaborate with other advocacy groups.

Currently, CILC provides:

- Information regarding Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) and Deferred Action for Parental Accountability (DAPA)
- Know-your-rights presentations to noncitizens detained by Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) in Wisconsin jails
- Know-your-rights presentations to affected community groups
- Trainings for volunteer lawyers, interpreters, and intake workers

1. Head east on US-12 E/US-18 E toward Exit 262
2. Take exit 263 to merge onto John Nolen Dr
3. Continue on S Blair St/US-151
4. Turn right at US-151/E Washington Ave
5. Turn left on Breatly Street

From WI-30 W

1. Head west on WI-30 W
2. Exit onto US-151/E Washington Ave
3. Turn right at N 1st St
4. Turn left at E Johnson St
5. Continue on E Gorham St
